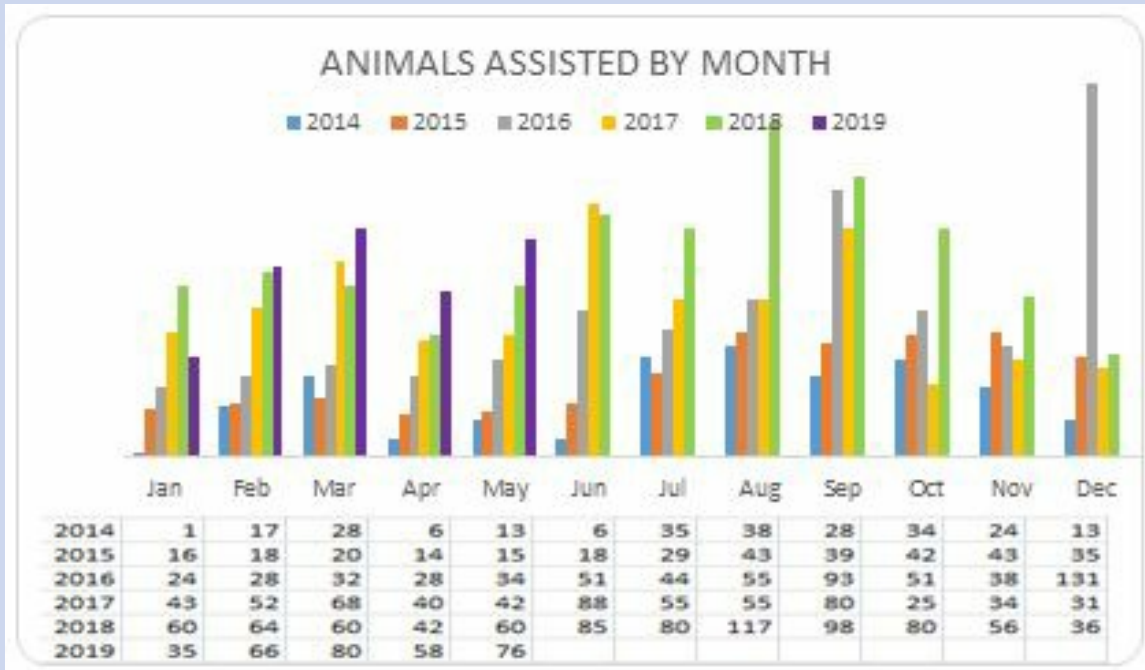
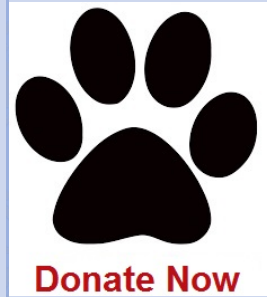

HEAT PET SAFETY!

<p>SHADE & WATER Protect your pets from the sun's rays and keep them hydrated.</p>	<p>NO CARS Never leave a pet in the car, not even with the window cracked.</p>	<p>HEAT STROKE Excessive panting, discolored gums, and mobility problems are signs. Seek veterinary attention immediately!</p>
<p>NO ASPHALT If it's too hot for bare feet, it's too hot for bare paws.</p>	<p>LIMIT EXERCISE Don't let playful pets over exert themselves in the heat.</p>	

With summer comes the high temperatures, but it does not necessarily need to reach the triple digits to put your pet at risk when left unattended in a car and it could land you in jail! Penalty enhancements are provided for subsequent convictions.

[Penal Code 597.7 PC Leaving a Pet in an Unattended Car](#)

This California statute provides that no person shall leave or confine an animal in any unattended motor vehicle under conditions that endanger the health or well-being of an

animal due to heat, cold, lack of adequate ventilation, or lack of food or water, or other circumstances that could reasonably be expected to cause suffering, disability, or death to the animal. In 2016, rescue provisions were added that allows a person to remove an animal in danger from a vehicle provided he or she meets several criteria listed in the law. A first conviction for violation of this section is punishable by a fine not exceeding \$100 per animal. If the animal suffers great bodily injury, a violation of this section is punishable by a fine not exceeding \$500, imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding six months, or by both a fine and imprisonment. Penalty enhancements are provided for subsequent convictions.

An independent study found that cracking the windows had very little effect on the temperature rise inside the vehicle. This is definitely a situation where "love 'em and leave 'em" is a good thing. Please leave your pets at home at home when you can...they'll be safe and happily waiting for you to come home.
