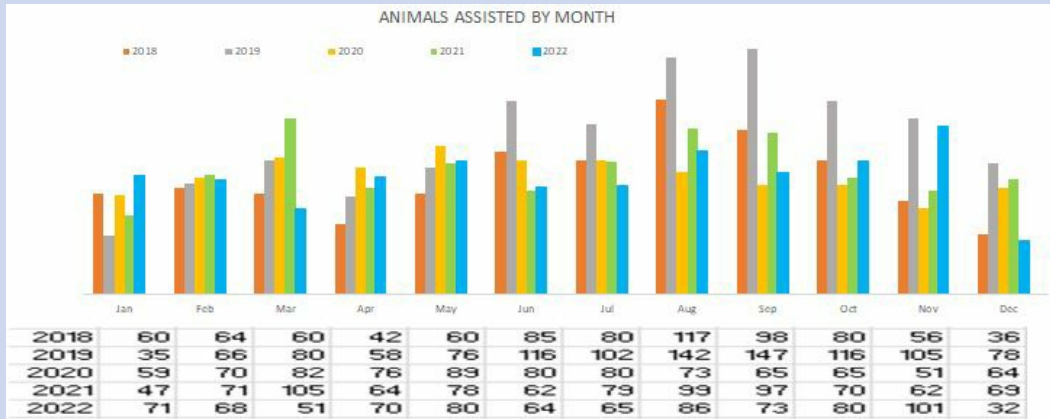
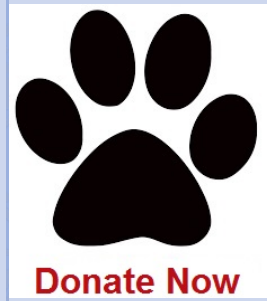

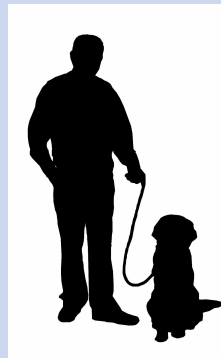
## Remi & Rip

Here are some commands for your new puppy:

1. **Sit.** It's the first command a puppy should learn!
2. **Stay.** Move one step away at a time.
3. **Come.** Watch it run to you!
4. **Down.** Use a gentle pull to reinforce.
5. **Go to your place.** Every dog needs to learn this.
6. **Wait.** No bolting out of open doors!
7. **Nipping.** Correct with gentle scolding, and praise when it stops.
8. **Barking.** A Quick pull or tug, and "quiet" gives it the message.
9. **Jumping.** Correct with a push to the chest and "Off!"
10. **Pulling.** Use a stop-and-sit correction until the dog adjusts to your pace.

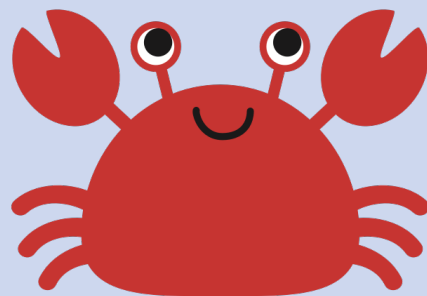

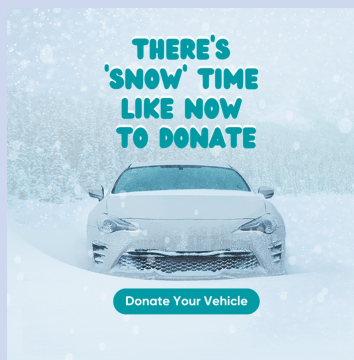
