

Help For A Domestic Tiger

Maria is the owner of a beautiful orange tabby named Tiger. In the past Tiger had a problem taking care of his business, evidenced by straining while in the litter box. The last time she took him to the vet it turned out he had a urinary

tract infection. Tiger was treated but it cost Maria several hundred dollars, money she had been putting away for emergencies. So, when she saw Tiger straining again she became very worried. The vet had told her that if a cat cannot urinate for twenty-four hours or more it can cause death. But she knew the cost of treatment would again run into hundreds of dollars and by now her emergency money was gone from previously treating Tiger. She just didn't have the money.

She was frightened for Tiger and unsure what she could do to help him. One of her friends told her about Paws In Need and called us for help. We sent Tiger and Maria to Bishop Ranch Veterinary Center where he received fluid therapy, medication and an education on the prescription diet that will keep Tiger healthy.

Tiger has made a full recovery as you can see from his picture. He is a beautiful cat Maria is proud to own! And we are proud we could help Tiger and Maria. Happy New Year to both of you!

The vet fit this dog into her schedule, scanned her for a microchip and scheduled her spay through our low cost spay/neuter program. The good Samaritan has since fallen in love with her and after an exhaustive search to make sure she wasn't anyone's lost pet, has decided to adopt her! From running on the freeway, malnourished and scared to a safe, warm home, we'd say Lucky is a fitting name for this girl.

Botched Declaw by Karen Simon



Lilli had been declawed before Kathy rescued her. She had a toe that became infected and her vet found that the declaw surgery had been done incorrectly and therefore there was a bone re-growth. Kathy depleted her funds on the initial diagnostic costs. Dr. Marshall at Feline Medical Center had to redo the declaw surgery to remove a bone growth on two toes of her front foot. It was a difficult surgery. Post-surgery she required medication - Clavamox to fight infection, Buprenorphine for pain, and Xanax for anxiety. She spent the days in Kathy's office and at night Lilli had to sleep in a pet "playpen." It was so important and so difficult to keep her restricted to prevent her from jumping without driving her crazy. Cats just do not understand when they need to "chill." Lilli is doing well, but the recovery was lengthy and difficult.

Note from Kathy: "There are no words to describe my appreciation for your help for Lilli. Thank you, from the bottom of my heart. My passion has always been to outlaw declawing of felines. And now, I have even greater passion about this because of poor Lilli's ordeal."

Second Chance
